The meeting was held at the Town Hall beginning at 8:00am June 9, 2015. Lianne Bedard read the greetings of Warrant for Annual Town Meeting. Lianne Bedard read Article #1 calling for the election of a Moderator

June 13, 2015 at 9:00am, in Hartford Town Hall the town meeting was reconvened by Moderator Richard Dyer, he read the results of the municipal election, as previously printed, and appointed Theresa Hayes as Deputy Moderator for the remainder of the meeting.

Deputy Moderator Hayes introduced Representative Richard Pickett of District #116 which Hartford became part of with the new redistricting. He thanked the voters for voting and said the state budget issue would be resolved; please contact him for information and assistance.

Deputy Moderator Hayes said with the voter's permission she would be using the modern manual for conducting Town Meetings, there were no objections. There were two requests from out of town speakers to address the body.

Paula Robinson, Sexual Assault Service Response formerly REACH and Jim Bouchard, Androscoggin Home Health and Hospice spoke concerning their organizations service to Hartford residents and the need for their requests to be approved.

Motion was made by Judith Hamilton and seconded by Tom Harvey to allow Craig Zurhorst of Western Maine Transportation to speak; motion was accepted by a show of hands. Craig spoke for Western Maine Transportation served 2 residents last year and Community Concepts currently serving 51 residents.

The Board of Selectmen may, without auction or advertisement, sell to the person or persons to whom a property was taxed at the time the property was acquired by the Town or to their heirs or assigns, such property at the amount of the accrued taxes, interest, lien costs and administrative fees as determined by State Law and the Board of Selectmen and therefore shall execute and deliver a Municipal Quit Claim Deed for such property.
